Nature Center and Library display art from China

Children's artwork from China, music, lion mask making and a dragon puppet workshop were all part of "Flying the Child's Hope" this past weekend at the New Canaan Nature center and the New Canaan Library.

"Flying the Child's Hope" is the product of the Children's Art on the Environment Project, sponsored by the 1990 Institute of the U.S. and the China National Children's Center and State Environmental Protection Administration.

The exhibit comprises 80 works of art with environmental themes selected from more than a million submitted by Chinese students ages 5-15.



The weekend's exhibition and activities were presented jointly by the Art Committee of the Friends of New Canaan Library and the New Canaan Nature Center and the artwork will be on display through Friday. October 10, at both the Nature Center and the Library.
